<u>1John 2:16</u> For all that is in the world—<u>the desires of the flesh and the desires of the eyes and pride of life</u>—is not from the Father but is from the world.

A The desires of the flesh

Sex—Proverbs 5; 6.20-29; 7.5; 22.4; 23.27-28

<u>Prov. 6:20</u> My son, keep your father's commandment, and forsake not your mother's teaching.

21 Bind them on your heart always;

tie them around your neck.

<u>22</u> When you walk, they⁴ will lead you; when you lie down, they will watch over you; and when you awake, they will talk with you.

23 For the commandment is a lamp and the teaching a light, and the reproofs of discipline are the way of life,

<u>24</u> to preserve you from the evil woman, from the smooth tongue of the adulteress.

<u>25</u> Do not desire her beauty in your heart, and do not let her capture you with her eyelashes;

<u>26</u> for the price of a prostitute is only a loaf of bread, but a married woman hunts down a precious life.

27 Can a man carry fire next to his chest and his clothes not be burned?

<u>28</u> Or can one walk on hot coals and his feet not be scorched?

29 So is he who goes in to his neighbor's wife; none who touches her will go unpunished.

Food and drink—Proverbs 23.2, 21; 28.7

Prov. 23:19 Hear, my son, and be wise, and direct your heart in the way.

20 Be not among drunkards

or among gluttonous eaters of meat,

21 for the drunkard and the glutton will come to poverty, and slumber will clothe them with rags.

B The desires of the eyes

Riches—Proverbs 11.4; 13.7; 23.4-5; 28.20 (but cf. 10.22)

Prov. 11:4 Riches do not profit in the day of wrath,

but righteousness delivers from death.

Prov. 23:4 Do not toil to acquire wealth;

be discerning enough to desist.

<u>5</u> When your eyes light on it, it is gone,

for suddenly it sprouts wings,

flying like an eagle toward heaven.

Prov. 28:25 A greedy man stirs up strife,

but the one who trusts in the LORD will be enriched.

Prov. 15:27 Whoever is greedy for unjust gain troubles his own household,

but he who hates bribes will live.

Prov. 11:28 Whoever trusts in his riches will fall,

but the righteous will flourish like a green leaf.

C The pride of life

Pride—Proverbs 13:10; 16:17-19; 17:19; 29:23

Prov. 13:10 By insolence comes nothing but strife,

but with those who take advice is wisdom.

Prov. 16:17 The highway of the upright turns aside from evil;

whoever guards his way preserves his life.

18 Pride goes before destruction,

and a haughty spirit before a fall.

19 It is better to be of a lowly spirit with the poor

than to divide the spoil with the proud.

Prov. 17:19 Whoever loves transgression loves strife;

he who makes his door high seeks destruction.

Prov. 29:23 One's pride will bring him low,

but he who is lowly in spirit will obtain honor.
